A Donor Bill of Responsibilities

PHILANTHROPY is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life. To ensure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that governments and their citizens can have full confidence that the tax benefits provided to donors result in appropriate public benefit, we declare that all donors have these responsibilities:

Ι.

To publicly communicate the donor's mission, the way the donor prioritizes allocation of tax-exempt resources, and the way that it ensures maximum contribution to the public interest.

II.

To publicly communicate the identity of those serving on its governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgement in its stewardship responsibilities to the public interest.

III.

To publicly communicate its most recent financial statements.

IV.

To pubicly communicate and implement methods for prioritizing and measuring the effectiveness of funding strategies.

V.

To acknowledge and recognize the responsibilities conferred with tax-exempt status.

VI.

To handle information about their grantees with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.

VII.

To ensure that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor are professional in nature.

VIII.

To publicly communicate whether funding decisions have been influenced by any factors other than the public interest.

IX.

To provide opportunities for citizens and government representatives to gain insight into their operations and decision-making.

X.

To provide prompt, truthful and forthright answers to questions received from citizens and government representatives.
